English Major Requirements for Literature and CT Tracks (39 Credits)

Core Curriculum (6 credits)

- ENGL 300 Texts and Contexts
- ENGL 301 Analysis of Literary Language

Literature Track* (15 credits)

- ENGL 302 Literary Methodologies and Research
- One course from four of the five historical periods:
 - A. Medieval and Early Modern 339
 - B. Restoration to Romantic 305
 - C. Victorian and Modern N/A
 - D. American Lit. to Civil War 307
 - E. American Lit.: Civil War to Present 308, 332

CT Track (15 credits)

- ENGL 324 Theories of Communication and Technology
- One course from each of the following four categories:
 - A. Professional/Technical Comm. 379
 - B. Rhetoric/Composition 391, 392
 - C. Media Literacies N/A
 - D. Journalism and Creative Nonfiction 317, 382

Note: With an advisor's approval, a 400-level course in a student's track may meet a period or category requirement as outlined above. A 400-level course used to meet a period or category requirement will not count toward the required 400-level courses below.

400-Level Courses (6 credits)

Two 400-level courses in a student's track (open to juniors as well as seniors).

• Literature – 413, 448, 464

• CT – 486, 493

Electives (12 credits)

- Four English courses at the 300 or 400 level, although students may include one 200-level course as an elective, with advisor's permission.
- Creative Writing courses can be used in either track as electives.
- ENGL 495: Internship can only be used for 3 credits maximum toward a student's electives.

Diversity Requirement

At least one of the required or elective courses must also fulfill the Diversity (D) requirement: 307, 317, 332, 339, 448, 464, 493

B.A./M.A. Courses

Up to 9 credits may be counted toward both the B.A. and M.A., provided the coursework is undertaken at the 600 level: 413/604, 448/648, 464/664, 486/686, 493/631, 601
