Major Requirements for Literature and CT Tracks (39 Credits)*

<p>Note: With an advisor’s approval, a 400-level course in a student’s track may meet a period or category requirement as outlined above. A 400-level course used to meet a period or category requirement will not count toward the required 400-level courses below.</p>	
400-Level Courses (6 credits)	
Two 400-level courses in a student’s track (open to juniors as well as seniors).	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Literature – 416, 448, 451 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CT – 486, 493
Electives (12 credits)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Four English courses at the 300 or 400 level, although students may include one 200-level course as an elective, with advisor’s permission. Creative Writing courses can be used in either track as electives. ENGL 495: Internship can only be used for 3 credits maximum toward a student’s electives. 	
Diversity Requirement	
At least one of the required or elective courses must also fulfill the Diversity (D) requirement: 315, 320.02, 364, 385, 448	
B.A./M.A. Courses	
Up to 9 credits may be counted toward both the B.A. and M.A., provided the coursework is undertaken at the 600 level: 416/616, 448/648, 451/651, 486/686, 493/625, 600
