English Major Requirements for Literature and CT Tracks (39 Credits)

Core Curriculum (6 credits)

<p>Note: With an advisor’s approval, a 400-level course in a student’s track may meet a period or category requirement as outlined above. A 400-level course used to meet a period or category requirement will not count toward the required 400-level courses below.</p>	
400-Level Courses (6 credits)	
Two 400-level courses in a student’s track (open to juniors as well as seniors).	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Literature – 410, 448, 451, 469 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CT – 493.01, 493.02, 493.03
Electives (12 credits)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Four English courses at the 300 or 400 level, although students may include one 200-level course as an elective, with advisor’s permission. Creative Writing courses can be used in either track as electives. ENGL 495: Internship can only be used for 3 credits maximum toward a student’s electives. 	
Diversity Requirement	
At least one of the required or elective courses must also fulfill the Diversity (D) requirement: 307, 320, 364, 469, 481, 493.01, 493.03	
B.A./M.A. Courses	
Up to 9 credits may be counted toward both the B.A. and M.A., provided the coursework is undertaken at the 600 level: 601, 410/610, 451/604, 493.01/631, 493.02/692, 493.03/625.
