Medieval and Early Modern – 315</li> <li>B. Restoration to Romantic – 350, 364</li> <li>C. Victorian and Modern – N/A</li> <li>D. American Lit to Civil War – 307</li> <li>E. American Lit: Civil War to Present – 308, 332</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;">CT Track (15 credits)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ENGL 324 – Theories of Communication &amp; Tech</li> <li>• One course from each of the following four categories:                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Professional/Technical Comm. – 326</li> <li>B. Rhetoric/Composition – 320, 386, 392</li> <li>C. Media Literacies – N/A</li> <li>D. Journalism and Creative Nonfiction – 383, 384</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p>Note: With an advisor’s approval, a 400-level course in a student’s track may meet a period or category requirement as outlined above. A 400-level course used to meet a period or category requirement will not count toward the required 400-level courses below.</p>	
<p>400-Level Courses (6 credits)</p> <p>Two 400-level courses in a student’s track (open to juniors as well as seniors).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Literature – 448, 469</li> <li>• CT – 493.01, 493.02</li> </ul>	
<p>Electives (12 credits)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Four English courses at the 300 or 400 level, although students may include one 200-level course as an elective, with advisor’s permission.</li> <li>• Creative Writing courses can be used in either track as electives.</li> <li>• ENGL 495: Internship can only be used for 3 credits maximum toward a student’s electives.</li> </ul>	
<p>Diversity Requirement</p> <p>At least one of the required or elective courses must also fulfill the Diversity (D) requirement: 386, 448, 469, 493.01</p>	
<p>B.A./M.A. Courses</p> <p>Up to 9 credits may be counted toward both the B.A. and M.A., provided the coursework is undertaken at the 600 level: 448/648, 469/669, 493.01/631, 493.02/671</p> <p>Note: Students interested in the accelerated <a href="#">B.A./M.A. program</a> should contact <a href="#">Dr. DiCuirci</a>.</p>
